



Reilly Family Memorial Scholarship

The Mechanical Contracting Education & Research Foundation (MCERF) and the John W. Danforth Company have established a scholarship to commemorate the memory of its leadership, the Reilly Family. Danforth is a charter member of the MCAA. Kevin "Duke" Reilly serves as Danforth's Chairman/CEO. Wayne, Patrick and Emmett Reilly contributed a combined 128 years of commitment and loyalty to their company and the industry. This national scholarship will symbolize the Reillys' many contributions to the mechanical contracting industry.

The \$5,000 scholarship will be presented to a worthy student, nominated by a faculty advisor of a chartered MCAA student chapter and selected by the Career Development Committee. The committee shall base its selection on the nomination that best meets or exceeds the criteria presented below.

The scholarship winner will be announced at the Annual Student Chapter Luncheon and Meeting, which takes place during the annual MCAA convention. **The winning nominee must be present at the luncheon to accept the award.** A member of the Reilly family or a designee will announce the winner.

Criteria

The nominee is:

1. A junior in a four-year program or a senior in a five-year program.
2. Majoring in construction management, mechanical engineering, architectural engineering or a discipline related to mechanical construction, mechanical service or plumbing contracting.
3. Has demonstrated exceptional scholastic achievement.
4. Has demonstrated leadership skills (i.e., either as an MCAA student chapter officer, leader of the MCAA student chapter competition team, fund-raising project, community service project, membership recruiting drive, etc.).
5. Has demonstrated interest in developing a career in the mechanical, mechanical service, or plumbing industry by working part-time or as an intern for an MCAA member for at least one summer or one term, whichever applies.
6. Has otherwise demonstrated characteristics or achievements that distinguish him/her as a nominee worthy of this scholarship.
