Finding Your Presentation Superpowers

Course Description: Workshop on becoming an effective facilitator. Learn that facilitating and speaking are not the same and that anyone can be a rock star facilitator by leveraging their strengths. Review the basics of effective presentation skills and learn how to avoid the dreaded "death by PowerPoint."

ITS 104: 4 hours There's an Activity for That

Course Description: Workshop geared towards effectively designing and implementing activities. Learn the S.L.A.E. approach to creating activities and turning material into engaging methods to retain, learn, and evaluate key learning objectives. Impactful activity implementation can take any class to the next level.

ITS 105: 4 hours

Teaching to the Generations

Course Description: By the end of the workshop participants will be able to identify and select teaching strategies and techniques that meet the needs of different generations. In addition, the group will compare and contrast differences between generations as it relates to learner traits and preferences. We will analyze and explain the need to change the way we transfer knowledge in the classroom and discuss the latest trends and buzz words in adult education and their implications to the classes we teach.
