Construction has one of the highest rates of death by suicide of all industries in the United States, about four times higher than the general population. The health and safety of our workers is the primary goal in the mechanical construction and service industry.

Together, the United Association of Plumbers and Pipefitters (UA) and the Mechanical Contractors Association of America (MCAA) are rethinking the way we approach mental health awareness and suicide prevention.

Our joint investment to spread awareness and normalize conversations around this issue could be one of the biggest opportunities to impact safety and health across our entire industry today. Mental health has a personal impact on so many people; everyone has a story; everyone is dealing with things on and off the jobsite.

The Department of Health and Human Services launched the easy to use 988 suicide and crisis lifelines to provide an outlet to those who are in need. This was our chance to develop a purposeful plan to spread our message of hope and support.

When people call or text 988, they will be connected to trained counselors who will listen, understand how their problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources.

The cause of mental health issues and death by suicide is not singular, and neither is the solution.
